SUKKOT – "THE SEASON OUR JOY!"

WHY WE CELEBRATE THE FEAST OF TABERNACLES

#1 Sukkot is *the Lord's feast*, which *He said* to *celebrate forever!*

Leviticus 23 ⁴ These are the set *feasts or* appointed seasons *of the Lord*, holy convocations you shall proclaim at their stated times...³⁴...The fifteenth day of this seventh month, and for seven days, is the Feast of Tabernacles *or* Booths to the Lord... ⁴¹ You shall keep it as a feast to the Lord for seven days in the year, a *statute forever*... AMP

The Hebrew word in verse 41, "owlam", means "forever", "eternity"

"The feasts are <u>not</u> 'Jewish' in an ethnic sense, <u>nor</u> are they 'Christian' in a religious sense. Instead, the feasts <u>are</u> 'divine' and 'eternal' in the biblical sense for <u>all</u> of God's people <u>forever</u>."

- **#2** *Jesus* celebrated the feasts, and *Paul* celebrated the feasts <u>30 YEARS</u> after Jesus' resurrection. (Luke 2:41; 22:15-16; Jn 2:13; 5:1; Acts 18:21; 20:16; I Cor 16:8)
- **#3** Paul told the Corinthians, who were *not ethnic Jews*, to celebrate the feasts.

I Corinthians 57...Christ our *Passover* also has been sacrificed. 8 *Therefore let us celebrate the feast*... NASB

Paul was saying that Jesus brought deeper meaning to the feasts, giving us all the more reasons to celebrate them! Paul wrote this to the Corinthian believers, who were *NOT Jewish*, a *quarter of a century AFTER* Jesus' resurrection. This makes it obvious that celebrating the feasts continued to be in God's plan for *non-Jewish* believers *decades* after the church began at the *Feast of Pentecost*. This lines up with God's own statement in Leviticus 23 that we will celebrate the feasts of the Lord for eternity!

#4 We are Abraham's descendants and citizens of Israel!

Galatians 3 ²⁹ *If you belong to Christ, then you are Abraham's descendants*, heirs according to promise. NASB

Ephesians 2 ¹¹ ...remember that *formerly* you who are Gentiles by birth... ¹² ... *WERE* separate from Christ, *excluded from citizenship in Israel* and foreigners to the covenants of the promise... ¹³ But *NOW* in Christ Jesus... ¹⁹ ... you are *no longer* foreigners and strangers, but *fellow citizens* with God's people... NIV *(vs. 15 "one new man")*

#5 Sukkot is the "Season of our Joy!"! We celebrate Jesus! EVERY FEAST OF GOD CENTERS AROUND JESUS!

John 1:14 says "The word (Jesus) became flesh (in Mary's womb) and did *tabernacle* among us (beginning at birth), and we beheld his *glory*..." YLT

Our English New Testaments were translated from the Greek language, not the Hebrew language, which often creates a challenge in tracing back to the original meanings of words. The Greek word for "tabernacle" (*skēnoō. See Strong's G4637*) literally means: "dwell in a *tent* or *tabernacle*". A Hebrew word for this is "sukkah", which literally means "*a temporary shelter*" (*see Strong's H5521*), such as a tent, booth, hut, or tabernacle. "Sukkot" is the plural form of "sukkah".

When Jesus was born, Mary put Him in a temporary shelter. If Luke 2:7 had been written in Hebrew, rather than Greek, the word probably would have been "sukkah". Regardless of the exact word chosen for translation (manger, booth, stall, etc), we know that Jesus' first "shelter" was "temporary".

Ever noticed that a <u>manger</u> looks a lot like a <u>sukkah</u>?

Another connection to sukkot is found is Luke 2 ¹⁰ The angel said... "...I bring you good news of *great joy* that will be for all the people." NIV

Deuteronomy 16 14 Rejoice at your festival...15...you are to be full of joy! CJB

Many believe... The angel was announcing the birth of Jesus as a fulfillment of Sukkot! The "great joy" was in response to Jesus coming in the flesh to Tabernacle among us through his birth during "The Feast of Tabernacles".

#6 We *celebrate* the feasts with *freedom from human rules*, and with new covenant revelation of how the feasts point to Jesus and all that He has done for us! Our relationship with Jesus makes the feasts *even more relevant today* than they were in the Old Testament!

Freedom From <u>Human</u> Rules (NIV) Col 2 ¹⁶ Let no one...**judge you** in eating or in drinking, or in respect of a **feast**, or of a new moon, or of sabbaths, ¹⁷ which are a **shadow** of the **coming things**, and the body [is] of **the Christ** YLT

I John 5 ³ For *this is the love of God*, that we keep His commandments; and *His commandments are not burdensome*. NASB

God's commandments challenge our flesh, but they don't vex us with religion.

#7 Sukkot is likely a *rehearsal* of the *"wedding feast of the Lamb"* that we will celebrate in heaven, when God will *tabernacle* among us. (Rev 19:9; 21:3)

HOW THE BIBLE SAYS TO CELEBRATE SUKKOT

- > "You are to be *full of JOY!*" (Deut 16:15, CJB) (Also, read Nehemiah 8)
- "Appear in the <u>presence</u> of Adonai" (Deut 16:16, CJB)
 Psalm 16 11 ... In Your <u>presence</u> is fullness of joy... NKJ
- ➤ "CELEBRATE in the presence of Adonai... for seven days" (Lev 23:40)
- "Not show up before Adonai empty-handed... give in accordance with the blessing... God has given you" (Deut 16:16-17, CJB)
- "Adonai said... 'On the fifteenth day of this seventh month is the feast of Sukkot for seven days to Adonai... on the <u>first day</u>... (and) on the <u>eighth</u> <u>day</u>... you are to have a <u>holy convocation</u>... a day of public assembly... <u>do</u> <u>not do any kind of ordinary work</u>" (Lev 23:33-36, CJB)
- "You are to live in sukkot for seven days; every citizen of Isra'el is to live in a sukkah, so that... you will know that I made the people of Isra'el live in sukkot when I brought them out of... Egypt..." (Lev 23:42-43 CJB)
- > REALIZE THAT FRUITFULLNESS COMES FROM YOUR CONNECTION TO JESUS!

Psalm 118 ¹⁵ The <u>sound of rejoicing and victory</u> is heard in the <u>tents</u> of the righteous... ²⁴ This is the day *Adonai* has made, <u>a day for us to rejoice and <u>be glad</u>... ²⁷ Adonai is God, and he gives us light. Join in the <u>pilgrim festival</u> with <u>branches</u>... _{CJB} vs 27...Decorate the <u>festival</u> with leafy boughs... _{AMP}</u>

vs. 27 ...with *branches in vour hands*, join the feast... NCV

John 15 ⁴ <u>Dwell</u> in Me, and I will dwell in you... ⁵ <u>I am the Vine; you are the branches</u>. Whoever <u>lives in Me</u> and I in him <u>bears much (abundant) fruit</u>. However, apart from Me [cut off from vital union with Me] you can do nothing. ⁶ If a person does not dwell in Me, he is thrown out like a <u>[brokenoff] branch</u>, and withers... ⁸ When you bear (produce) much fruit, My Father is honored <u>and</u> glorified... ¹¹ I have told you these things, that <u>My joy</u> and delight may be in you, and that <u>your joy and gladness</u> may be of full measure <u>and</u> complete <u>and overflowing</u>.
